

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Master of Occupational Health program is intended to prepare students for careers or responsibilities dealing with health and safety problems in the workplace. It is designed for professionals with diverse academic backgrounds. Emphasis is on principles and methods of occupational health and safety and their application in the provision of health care to workers in all occupations or workplaces.

PROGRAM OBJECTIVE

- Implement health promotion and education strategies in addressing occupational health and safety (OHS) issues;
- Apply research skills and evidence-based solutions in addressing OHS issues;
- Manage OHS programs and services effectively in multi-disciplinary and multi-cultural settings;
- Lead in the application of innovative and socially-responsive approaches for the prevention and management of injury and disease in the workplace;
- Effectively use Filipino and English communication skills in both oral and written form;
- Demonstrate the ability to successfully work in inter-professional collaboration settings while adhering to professional, social, and ethical standards;
- Exemplify positive Filipino values (e.g. damayan, bayanihan, hospitality, compassion) in the conduct of OHS practice; and
- Engage in lifelong learning in the field of OHS.

Submission of Applications:

1st Semester: February until the last working day of April 2nd Semester: September until the last working day of October

The following are the grade requirements for each student to be of good standing in the program:

1) General weighted average of 2.00 or better;

- 2) Weighted average of 2.00 or better for the major/required courses; and
- 3) No grade of 5.00 in any academic course.

**A maximum of 5 years is given to a student to finish the program.

Living accommodations for students may be provided in privately-owned housing units/dorms/apartment hotels. Dorms offer lodging and/or board. There are privately-owned eateries around the school.









The following are the minimum NGOHS requirements:

- 1. Good scholastic record from any recognized institution of higher learning.
- 2. Graduates with professional training in medicine, nursing, dentistry, engineering and related fields.
- 3. At least 1 year work experience in the related field.
- 4. Duly accomplished Application Form (downloadable through the NGOHS website: ngohs.upm.edu.ph)
- 5. Comply with the General requirements found on the 2nd page of the Application Form (UPM-NGS-OP-01F1)

Graduation Requirements:

- Residency of at least 1 full academic year immediately prior to the granting of the degree.
- Completion of a minimum of 34 units through: □ Plan A or Thesis Plan - 29 units of academic courses
 - JPlan A or Thesis Plan 29 units of academic courses _plus 6 units of thesis.
- ☐ Plan B or Comprehensive Exam Plan 34 units of academic courses and a grade of "pass" in the comprehensive examination GWA of 2.00 or better in major courses and in all courses taken provided there is no grade of 5.00 in any of them.
- Certificate of submission of paper for Publication.
