

#### PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Master of Public Health program is designed to equip students with a broad range of skills, knowledge, and attitudes derived from various disciplines which enable them to critically assess and deal effectively with the broad spectrum of public health problems and issues at the local, national and international levels. The program is also designed to provide knowledge and develop skills in specific areas within public health relevant to the student's career goals.

#### **PROGRAM OBJECTIVE**

The program outcomes are now outcome-based and aligned with the identified roles of an MPH graduate who is competent to respond to global and local public health issues. The outcomes are also aligned with the eight (8) domains of Core Competencies for Public Health Professionals (Council on Linkages between Academic and Public Health Practice, 2021).


1st Semester: February until the last working day of April 2nd Semester: September until the last working day of October

# The following are the grade requirements for each student to be of good standing in the program:

- 1) General weighted average of 2.00 or better:
- 2) Weighted average of 2.00 or better for the major/required courses; and
- 3) No grade of 5.00 in any academic course.
- \*\*A maximum of 5 years is given to a student to finish the program.

Living accommodations for students may be provided in privately-owned housing units/dorms/apartment hotels. Dorms offer lodging and/or board. There are privately-owned eateries around the school.









## The following are the minimum NGOHS requirements:

- 1. Approval of the applicant's qualification for graduate work in public health by the MPH Committee.
- 2. Graduate of a baccalaureate degree from any recognized institution of higher learning.
- 3. At least 1-year of work experience in the related field.
- 4. Duly accomplished Application Form (downloadable through the NGOHS website: ngohs.upm.edu.ph)
- 5. Comply with the General requirements found on the 2nd page of the Application Form (UPM-NGS-OP-01F1)

# **Graduation Requirements:**

- Residency of at least 1 full academic year immediately prior to the granting of the degree.
- Completion of a minimum of 30 units through: Core courses: 22 units
- Elective courses: 8 units
- ☐ GWA of 2.00 or better in major courses and in all courses taken provided there is no grade of 5.00 in any of them.
