- 3) No grade of 5.00 in any academic course.

***A maximum of 5 years is given to a student to finish the program.*

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS CHECKLIST

1. Bachelor's degree from a recognized university/tertiary institution.
2. Good scholastic record from university/ institution of higher learning.
3. Duly accomplished Application Form (downloadable through the NGOHS website: ngohs.upm.edu.ph)
4. Comply with the General requirements found on the 2nd page of the Application Form (UPM-NGS-OP-01F1)

Graduation Requirements:

- Passing a comprehensive examination.
- GWA of 2.00 or better in major and in all courses taken.
- Satisfactory completion and submission of the required hard bound copies of thesis, and electronic copy of manuscript.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Master of Science in Clinical Medicine (Family and Community Medicine) is a track program of the College of Medicine Philippine General Hospital, University of the Philippines Manila. This is in response to the increasing demands of Family Medicine practitioners for further academic and research improvement in the Philippines and the Asia Pacific Region. This program track will enhance the competency of the family physicians in research, clinical work and Family Medicine education. It will provide family physicians additional expertise in their special areas of interest in Family Medicine. The program shall strengthen the integration of biopsychosocial clinical aspects of education and practice. The degree will likewise enable Family Medicine practitioners to formulate and implement Quality Assurance Programs and integrate counseling and hospice care into their clinical practice.

PROGRAM OBJECTIVES

At the end of the program, the graduate is expected to:

- Apply Family and Community Medicine in teaching, training, and administration;
- Conduct and apply research output to medical science geared towards their areas of interest;
- Formulate educational program in special areas such as: Counseling, Hospice and Palliative Care, Quality Assurance, Family Wellness and Evidence-Based Family Practice;
- Integrate biopsychosocial clinical aspects of education and practice as a teacher, researcher, specialist, or as an administrator or a manager; and
- Carry out responsibilities in organizing Family and Community Medicine program, research and service.
