

PROFESSIONS EDUCATION (PROFESSIONAL TRACK)



PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Master in Health Professions Education (MHPEd - Professional Track) program is specifically designed to improve both theoretical and practical competencies of health professions educators in their various roles as facilitators of learning, curriculum and assessment instructional designers, student evaluators, administrators and educational leaders, and researchers. At the end of the program, MHPEd graduates are expected to complete a capstone project.

PROGRAM OBJECTIVES

- 1. Communicate effectively in written and oral forms about matters pertaining to health professions education.
- 2. Demonstrate professionalism, cultural competence, and the ability to collaborate with other health professionals.
- 3. Exhibit nationalism and internationalism in the practice of the teaching profession.
- 4. Develop context-based macro and micro-plans for health professions education.
- 5. Demonstrate advance teaching skills based on best evidence.
- 6. Demonstrate effective educational leadership abilities and administrative skills.
- 7. Evaluate educational programs and studies.
- 8. Utilize relevant evidence when planning, conducting, and evaluating HPEd programs.

The following are the grade requirements for each student to be of good standing in the program:

- 1) General weighted average of 2.00 or better;
- 2) Weighted average of 2.00 or better for the major/required courses; and
- 3) No grade of 5.00 in any academic course.
- **A maximum of 5 years is given to a student to finish the program.

Living accommodations for students may be provided in privately-owned housing units/dorms/apartment hotels. Dorms offer lodging and/or board. There are privately-owned eateries around the school.









Applicants should have:

- 1.A 4-year baccalaureate degree in health profession from the University of the Philippines or other approved university or tertiary institution considered acceptable by UPM.
- 2. Teaching and/or administrative experience for at least two years in an institution responsible for the teaching of health personnel.
- 3. Good scholastic record from any recognized institution of higher learning.
- 4. For all applicants from countries where English is not the medium of instruction: Certificate from the International English Language Testing System (IELTS) (i.e. Band 6) OR Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) (i.e. at least 550 for written test, 173 for computerized test, and 70 for internet-based test).

The following are the minimum NGOHS requirements:

- Good scholastic record from any recognized institution of higher learning.
- 2. At least 1 year of work experience in the related field.
- 3. Duly accomplished Application Form (downloadable through the NGOHS website: ngohs.upm.edu.ph)
- 4. Comply with the General requirements found on the 2nd page of the Application Form (UPM-NGS-OP-01F1)

Graduation Requirements:

- At least one full academic year of residency immediately preceding the awarding of a degree.
- Completion of at least 30 formal course units.
- A GWA of 2.00 or higher in all major courses and all courses are taken, assuming that none of these courses have a grade of 5.00.
