PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Master in Physical Therapy is a two-year health science program that prepares graduates to be self-directed physical therapists who constantly strive to achieve optimal outcome in patient/client care through inherent and judicious use of theory, evidence, and clinical reasoning.

PROGRAM OBJECTIVES

This program aims to:

1. Demonstrate advanced competencies in specific areas of specialization in clinical practice.
2. Apply current and emerging theories in effective management of patients and clients.
3. Evaluate evidence to help make clinical decisions.
4. Apply clinical reasoning, including scientific evidence and ethics in the clinical setting.
5. Conduct scientific inquiry to address a specific clinical question.
6. Communicate and coordinate effectively with recipients of care, colleagues, and other members of the healthcare team in active pursuit of the best management for the patients/clients.
7. Demonstrate professional behaviors expected of a competent physical therapist.

The following are the grade requirements for each student to be of good standing in the program:

- 1) General weighted average of 2.00 or better;
 - 2) Weighted average of 2.00 or better for the major/required courses; and
 - 3) No grade of 5.00 in any academic course.
- **A maximum of 5 years is given to a student to finish the program.**

Living accommodations for students may be provided in privately-owned housing units/dorms/apartment hotels. Dorms offer lodging and/or board. There are privately-owned eateries around the school.



The following are the minimum NGOHS requirements:

1. Good scholastic record from any recognized institution of higher learning.
2. Holder of a degree in Bachelor of Science in Physical Therapy.
3. PRC Board Certificate (for PT professionals).
4. Must have a license to practice physical therapy in the Philippines.
5. Preferably at least six (6) months of documented professional experience in clinical practice.
6. Expressed professional needs and career goals of the applicant must match the program.
7. Have expressed professional needs and career goals that match the program.
8. Must undergo an interview.
9. Must show proof of at least a satisfactory (based on the school's grading scale) rating in assessment and treatment techniques during undergraduate courses.
10. Certification that one's work supports the applicant's intent to study.
11. For clinicians, a recent sample of treatment plan and evaluation of a client (de-identified)
12. Essay (800 to 1000 words; Limit to 1-page, no smaller than 10.5 font, single space) on the following questions:
 - ☐ How do you think MPT will influence your career?
 - ☐ Upon graduating from MPT, what knowledge and skill-set do you expect to have?
 - ☐ What is your motivation for pursuing graduate study?
 - ☐ What is your view of self-directed learning as a method of instruction?
