PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Master of Clinical Audiology (MClinAud) is a two-year health science program that integrates basic theoretical knowledge and clinical applications in the prevention and management of hearing impairments. The program covers the areas of audiologic evaluation, audiologic habilitation, hearing conservation, and the development of audiology service delivery programs primarily in the Philippines.

- □ Additional clinical exposure may be arranged as needed to complete the 300 hours.
- □ Passing a comprehensive examination.
