

MASTER OF SCIENCE IN CLINICAL MEDICINE (CHILD HEALTH)



PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Master of Science in Clinical Medicine (Child Health) is a two-year course designed to develop pediatricians into child health program managers with professional skills in research, teaching, policy making and administration. Graduates of this course are expected to develop curricular and instructional courses, undertake relevant research and conduct policy-making and managerial activities in their respective workplaces, related to child health.

PROGRAM OBJECTIVES

At the end of the program, the graduate is expected to have gained a broader knowledge and exhibited skills in the current child health management programs in the context of:

- Teaching;
- Health policy research in child health; and
- Development and administration of health programs in the community, hospital and clinics.

The following are the grade requirements for each student to be of good standing in the program:

- 1) General weighted average of 2.00 or better;
- 2) Weighted average of 2.00 or better for the major/required courses; and
- 3) No grade of 5.00 in any academic course.
- **A maximum of 5 years is given to a student to finish the program.

Living accommodations for students may be provided in privately-owned housing units/dorms/apartment hotels. Dorms offer lodging and/or board. There are privately-owned eateries around the school.





The following are the minimum NGOHS requirements:

- Good scholastic record from any recognized institution of higher learning.
- 2. Doctor of Medicine degree and/or graduate of an accredited residency program in Pediatrics.
- 3. Duly accomplished Application Form (downloadable through the NGOHS website: ngohs.upm.edu.ph)
- 4. Comply with the General requirements found on the 2nd page of the Application Form (UPM-NGS-OP-01F1)

Graduation Requirements:

A candidate for the degree of Master of Science in Clinical Medicine (Child Health) must comply with the rules of graduation of the University.

- Residency of at least one full academic year prior to granting of degree
- Completion of academic requirements with a general weighted average not lower than 2.0.
- ☐ Passing a comprehensive examination in the department.
- For Diploma program: Completion of 28 units of course work
- ☐ For MS Program:
 - a. Completion of 30 units of course work and 6 units of thesis.
 - b. Completion of thesis, which must be an original research work that constitutes a substantial contribution to knowledge or skill in Child Health, through oral and written form and satisfactory completion and submission of the required hard bound copies of thesis, and electronic copy of manuscript.
